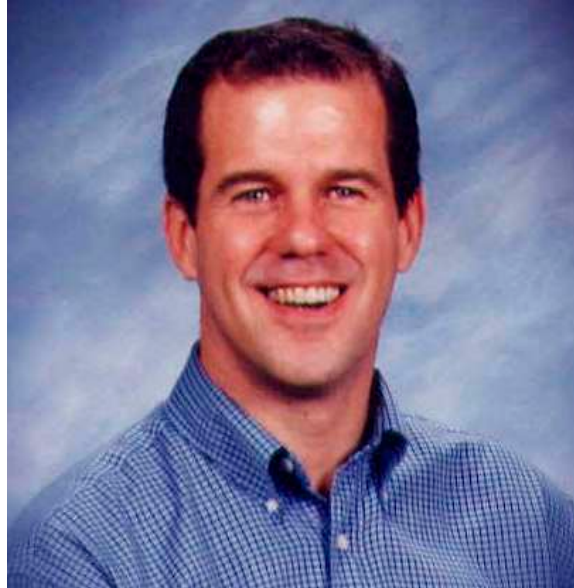
Fourteenth Annual Hill Country Family History Seminar
